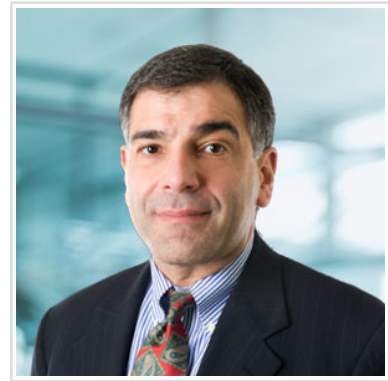


John S. Anooshian
