Mike Kassak, Intellectual Property Group Co-Chair and Josh Mooney, Cyber Law and Data Protection Group Co-Chair, have been reappointed as Vice-Chairs to the Cybersecurity and Data Privacy General Committee of the American Bar Association (ABA) Tort Trial and Insurance Practice Section (TIPS). Their one-year terms as Vice-Chair will begin at the conclusion of the 2019 Annual Meeting in August and extend through the 2019-20 bar year. Both Mike and Josh have been serving in these positions since being appointed to the committee last year.

Launched in 2017, the Cybersecurity and Data Privacy General Committee confronts issues facing TIPS members and their clients through active programming, informational resources and discussion groups. The committee is an extension of the previously established Cybersecurity Task Force, which examines and addresses the myriad and rapidly developing issues concerning cybersecurity and data privacy.
